# FROM THE BENCH ANDY LEESE

Welcome to Leatherhead for this Isthmian League Premier Division match. They have had a decent start to the season, and we will have to be at our best to get anything from the game

Our best will need to be 100% better than what we have served up the last two games. After a decent opening week against the backdrop of all the issues we had, we won our opening two league games and, even though we exited the FA Cup on penalty kicks in Peterborough after a hard fought game, I felt we deserved better.

That was definitely not the case at Bishops' Stortford where we played our best football for a while but defended poorly as team. The same pattern followed at Horsham earlier this week, and it is a cause for concern.

We identified and addressed the issues after the Stortford game but it seems we did not take on board what was agreed to rectify some basic issues.

Horsham opened us up in the second half and we made some horrible errors that cost us. It has been addressed again this week but the players are in no doubt that it is unacceptable to perform like that.

Too early to be worried, maybe, but we have to start taking responsibility for performances and the application of the work we do. And preferably immediately if we are serious about our ambitions. The demands we make of each other have to increase, and I need to see a reaction to the dismal showing on Tuesday night.

As I said last time within this pages the management team has been minus Ed Thompson - while his son pursues a career at Tottenham. We have recruited Jake Murphy as goalkeeping coach to replace Ed, and I am sure you will all welcome him to the club. The relationship with Nathan and Alfie is an important one as goalkeepers like to work a certain way to stay sharp and focused. I am sure Jake will improve the lads and ensure that they are fully prepared each week.



Your support for the team will be vital again this season. The club continues to be a great story; I have seen it close up in midst of the covid-19 crisis. Let's all work together to make that story even better.



# TOWN ARCHIVES

## 15 YEARS AGO 11TH OCTOBER 2005 SOUTHERN LEAGUE DIVISION ONE (EAST) Enfield Town (0) 0 Boreham Wood (0) 2

Wood secured an important top-of-the-table victory against their local rivals to open up a seven-point lead in pole position.

Had newly promoted Town taken their chances in an open opening period, it may well have been a different story. But second-half strikes from Ian Cooper and Chris Bangura turned the tide in Wood's favour, which eventually underscored an emphatic win.

Wood dominated the opening exchanges before Bryan Hammatt's flicked header from a corner produced the first chance of the game after 14 minutes. Hammatt then reacted superbly to a through ball, finding space to fire a fierce volley, which Noel Imber acrobatically tipped to safety diving full stretch.

With Town assuming the upper hand, the visitors were tested thoroughly and Lee Harvey at the back caught the eye. But Wood threatened via a fierce Ian Cooper volley, which flew just over the bar, before Harvey set Leon Archer away down the right. He in turn crossed near post where Russell Penn was on hand to deny Chris Bangura a shot on goal. Skipper Rudi Hall missed a gilt-edged opportunity he miskicked in front of goal after fine work from Paul Campbell.

Hall atoned after the break when he executed a brilliant, low curling free kick on 50 minutes, allowing Lee Smith through on goal only to miss a great chance. But from then on it was a different story. Ken Kamata in the Town goal was caught out controlling an admittedly difficult back pass, Cooper charged down the eventual clearance and lashed home after 55 minutes.

Shortly afterwards Chris Watters found Archer, who drilled a low volley just wide. The killer goal arrived on 63 minutes from a set piece. Michael Black delivered a long free-kick to the far post and Ryan Moran rose to nod into the path of Bangura to volley past Kamata.

## 10 YEARS AGO 9TH OCTOBER 2010 | FA CUP THIRD QUALIFYING ROUND Boreham Wood (0) 3 Enfield Town (0) 1

This was a memorable, gallant effort from the Isthmian Division One North leaders, but Wood ended up going into the hat for the next round, albeit with less comfort than the score might have suggested.

Town gave as good as they received throughout the tie. Marshalled by the excellent Mark Kirby at the back, a Mario Noto low effort was all the hosts had to show in the opening half. The shot beat 'keeper Rob Blackburne but was cleared off the line at the far post by Adam Wallace.

Town tested the Wood defence with Lee Kersey hooking away to deny Paul Campbell a shot at goal, and Dan Forward having a shot blocked by Noto. Chances came and went at both ends before the interval with Jordan Lockie managing a shot on target from 25 yards which failed to trouble Ashlee Jones unduly.

Godfrey's turn and shot after the interval, looked like a promising start for Wood, but Ian Allinson's men went into their shells briefly as Town got on top. However the deadlock was broken when Greg Morgan cut in from the right, evaded two challenges and passed to Luke Garrard who placed the ball beyond Blackburne. Just minutes later, Kirby broke up play on the edge of his area and set Forward away. The ball was laid out to Sam Byfield, and his left-wing cross was inch perfect for Bryan Hammatt to nod home.

Both keepers were tested, with Jones' save from sub Andy Jones looking crucial. Morgan, cutting in from the right, supplied Elliott Godfrey in a central position just inside the Town penalty area. He continued the move picking out Joe Benjamin on the left who fired home under Blackburne.

With Town understandably pushing forward in numbers, they were caught on the counter with a minute left, substitute Lee Allinson executing a fine lob from distance over Blackburne.

This was the first leg of a memorable cup pairing, albeit a damp squib in comparison to the replay, with the winners being paired with Chesham United and a useful £7,500 in prize money.


It was Hitchin who arguably had the best of the very few clear-cut chances in the home clash. Jonny McNamara was denied the chance to convert John Frendo's squared pass with Harold Joseph getting in ahead of him a yard from the goalline, while the same player also stung the hands of Nathan McDonald when he ran through on goal, hitting his shot with the ball sitting up.

Dan Webb also forced McDonald into a save, while Alasan Ann thought his strike into a crowded box had hit on Enfield arm.

Town's best chances came at either end of the first half, with a Harry Ottaway downward header off target and Ryan Doyle forcing visiting keeper Charlie Horlock to tip over the bar. The game attracted a healthy Non-League Day attendance of 883.

# MORE MIDWEEK MISERY

## HORSHAM 5 ENFIELD TOWN 2

Town conceded five for the first time since April 2018, but with a second half chastening handed out by the opposition for the second successive Tuesday night.

The visitors had recovered well from the blow of conceding in the first ten minutes to lead at half time. But the defensive frailties which had dogged them at Bishop's Stortford seven days earlier reappeared after the break.

Missing influential midfielder Scott Thomas through work commitments and still without injured striker Shaun Okojie, Town began brightly and forced a couple of corners. But a ninth minute through ball from Tom Day split the visitors' rearguard and fell to Chris Smith, who fired past the exposed Nathan McDonald.

It was, nevertheless, end-to-end stuff at this stage, although a last ditch tackle from Josh Urquhart prevented further damage. After McDonald had saved from Rob O'Toole, Lewis Taylor fired over when well placed.

Horsham gradually gained control, with McDonald punching clear acrobatically at full stretch and then saving impressively from Will Miles' header. Ten minutes before the break Percy Kiangebeni's effort was saved comfortably by home keeper Brad House. A Charlie Harris free kick wasn't too far away but then Town delivered a double sucker punch as the hosts began to wind down for the half-time break.

Firstly, Larry Asare and Kiangebeni combined to set up Jon Muleba to charge down the right, and then his low cross was converted at the near post by Sam Youngs, despite the ball being slightly behind him. The travelling contingent were then delighted by a long, curling free kick from Lyle Della-Verde being headed past House by Billy Bricknell to stun the Hornets.

Alas, Town couldn't capitalise on the position they had found themselves in after 45 minutes, and the scores were level eight minutes into the second period.

After some wizardry from Della-Verde had fashioned a cross which was just too high for Urquhart, a familiar-looking break from the hosts ended with Reece Hall playing the ball in from the left and finding former Worthing and Bognor man Harvey Sparkes to side-foot home.



Smith fed O'Toole on 67 minutes, and the latter placed his shot just beyond the far post. But Town supporters were biting back their disappointment as a promising move involving Muleba and Della-Verde broke down, the ball was shifted quickly towards the opposite end and moved from Day on the left to Taylor on the right for Harris to fire home crisply from 25 yards.


Substitute Jared Small found Junior Mubiyai, who looped a header over the top and then Bricknell's back heel was kept out low down by House. But the feeling of déjà vu continued as, with the visitors pressing in numbers, a corner was cleared at speed leaving a three-on-three situation and Harris drilled the ball past McDonald at an acute angle to kill off all Town's hopes. An icing on-the-cake hat-trick was claimed by Harris with an added time strike which went in off a post to confirm Horsham's first league win of the season.

## TALKING TO... GRAHAM DODD

**Graham became Town's Head of Football Operations at the start of the season. We caught up with him recently...**

After two seasons helping to manage the Under 23s in the Isthmian Development League, and the discontinuation (for the time being at least) of the side, when Andy Leese asked me to stay on at the club this season, it was really a no brainer. I'd really enjoyed the couple of years, was impressed with how professionally the club is run, had made new friends and met any number of old friends (mainly in the bar!)...and I needed a role to keep me involved in football and away from empty Saturdays!

A Step 3 club was in reality a promotion for me when I first joined, having spent many years at Step 5, at initially at Brimsdown Rovers, where I was a player, manager and then, for ten years, Chairman of the football section, before business pressures forced me to step down. I ground-hopped for a number of seasons before getting back in the dugout at Broxbourne Borough - where one of my sons was playing. What was supposed to be a few weeks helping out turned into years (admittedly with a few breaks!) and that is when I first really got to know Andy.

Having served on the old Spartan League board as a club representative many years ago, I gained a schooling in another side of Non-

League football which was quite eye opening at first, but I've never regretted making that commitment and, as a Life Vice President of the Spartan South Midlands League I still keep in touch with that league on a weekly basis. I've reached an age whereby quite a few players who have played under me at some point are now managers or coaches, and they are connections I'm already using in my new role at the QEII Stadium as Head of Football Operations.

I see my role primarily as a support function to the first team management group, being involved with them as necessary and being their link with the various under 18 teams, in addition to supporting and guiding the U18 managers, including the Academy. The Club's reliance on the 18s to provide a pathway to the first team this season is well documented, and I hope my experience will be of benefit to them. I'll certainly be watching as many of their games as possible.

One hurdle we collectively need to overcome this season is the lack of U23 midweek football to give first team squad players game time and, on the other side of the coin, U18s experience at senior level. Sending players out on loan - sometimes for a specified period and sometimes

not - is the key to this and this is where my connections at Steps 4 and 5 come into play. For example, Malcolm Podier and Patrick Akwasi are currently at Southern League Division One Central Welwyn Garden City (Step 4) and, more recently Jude Brown, has moved across to Essex Senior League Walthamstow (Step 5). Depending upon our injuries and suspensions situation at any given time there may be others in the pipeline; it's something constantly under review. I'll go and watch these boys occasionally, but I can also rely on the management of these clubs to keep me in the loop about their progress.

You will rarely see me at first team away games as I use those Saturdays and midweek dates to sometimes look at future opposition for Andy, or perhaps at a specific player who has been recommended to us or who we have heard good reports about. Otherwise I might just choose a local game where you may spot the occasional diamond. I found Lewis King playing for Wormley Rovers at Step 6 level, when I'd actually gone to watch Broxbourne Borough's centre back with the U23s in mind! Whilst it didn't quite work out here for Lewis, there is no doubt he is of higher quality than Step 6. And there are many more players like Lewis at the lower levels who are more than capable of playing higher up the pyramid.

I am always happy to interact with members and supporters. Without seeking to restrict access to Andy, Maz and Steve of course, I'm more than happy to discuss any football related matters, be it the first team or the U18s, and I may be able to throw some light on why a certain player is not in the squad, how they are getting on elsewhere, or maybe where we have found new players. I'd equally always be happy to receive player recommendations!

Finally, I've also agreed to try and boost the club's coffers through sponsorship and advertising, as that's my professional background. So, once again, I'd be very happy to talk about potential income options! Even if it's a question of perhaps you pointing me in the right direction to have discussions with somebody else, more than happy to discuss it. It's an area of increased importance in these difficult times, so please think about any way in which you can help, or have ideas for fundraising.

## NON-LEAGUE PAPER

Here we go again. Last week, Boris Johnson urged people to go back to the cinemas following the sad decision of Cineworld to temporarily close its 127 theatres across the UK, affecting 45,000 jobs writes Sam Emery.

Sadly, it's an all-too familiar story in these strange Covid times, bearing a striking comparison to the football industry, which too has been left to pick up the pieces from the effects of the global pandemic.

So, the question remains then Boris, if you are pleading with people to go back to watching films in the cinema - a small, enclosed arena with very little room for manoeuvre or ventilation - then why can't fans return to football in a much larger, outdoor, socially-distanced environment?

Last Saturday, 15 Vue Cinemas - Cineworld's main market rival - showed live Premier League matches, well attended by fans. How can you watch football in a cinema but not in an open-air stadium? That's madness.

Quite frankly, I'm amazed - and mightily relieved - that more proud, well-established football clubs haven't fallen foul to these testing Covid times, and credit for that lies with the people who work tirelessly - usually without financial reward - to keep our clubs alive.

But, with a second Coronavirus wave threatening to kick in and tougher restrictions gradually being put in place, there comes a point when something has to give, as Cineworld has shown. Last week's £10m Government bailout to the National League at least papers over the cracks for a few months but, at the time of writing this column, clubs are still awaiting news of their reimbursements, almost a week on and with their season already underway.

Indeed, poor communication throughout has been a huge issue during this uncertain summer and that's something that needs to be addressed in any future Covid post-mortem. Personally, I'm still dismayed by a lack of assistance, and greed sometimes, of the mega-rich Premier League and its member clubs during this crisis.

No fewer than six players in Gareth Southgate's England squad for this week's friendly with Wales and Nations League games against Belgium and Denmark boast a Non-League background. Doesn't that show that football at this level is impacting higher up the Pyramid?

In a week when Macclesfield Town were wound up by the High Court with debts totalling £500,000, Chelsea were spending £22 million for a replacement goalkeeper. A couple of weeks later, Arsenal then opted to severely damage their once-proud community ties by dumping its much-loved mascot Gunnersaurus - for the sake of £120 a week - before then spending £45 million on Thomas Partey.

Obviously, I'm not suggesting bailouts of those proportions, but what a gesture it would be from the 20 Premier League clubs if they put aside, say, £1 million each, to strengthen their community ties when it is needed most and keep their local clubs alive?

Cineworld's demise is a worrying turn of events for the entertainment industry, of which sport plays a significant part. Agreed, Boris, let us support our cinemas, theatres and music venues - socially distanced, of course - but how about including football stadiums in that too?

The Beveren fans also had more than a few light ales in Butler's Bar during the course of what turned out to be a memorable day. The travelling Tanners fans also made lots of noise behind their team to add to the occasion.

Obviously today will be a slightly different atmosphere due to the current worldwide pandemic situation we find ourselves in, but we will welcome the visiting supporters of a club with a superb history – as we always do – with a smile and some good natured banter I'm sure. No handshakes yet though!

Congratulations go out to the Tanners legendary central-defender Jerry Nnamani who recently made his 400th appearance for the club. A fine achievement. Not many players play that many games for just one club nowadays. He has had offers to play elsewhere but has stayed loyal to the club he clearly loves, being quoted as saying "I'm sure many people go to work and feel undervalued and unappreciated, so I feel lucky that that's not the case when it comes to football."

Our opponents today will probably include centre-forward Great Evans, who turns 20 in a few weeks' time. He came through the academy ranks at AFC Wimbledon and is definitely a player to keep an eye on. He scored 19 goals in 37 games for South Park before a short spell with Wingate & Finchley last season. His unique name may certainly help a few headline writers in the press box at Fetcham Grove. 'It's a Great victory for Leatherhead' etc .... hopefully not this afternoon, though!

The road to Wembley in the Buildbase FA Vase continues over this weekend. Park View versus Cockfosters is a game of local interest. The home side currently play at the New River Sports Stadium in White Hart Lane and their roots lie within the Ghanaian community of Tottenham and Haringey. 'Fosters have made a great start to their 2020-21 campaign, winning all six of their league games.

They have never really had much luck in the Vase, with their best run being reaching the second round on a few occasions – the last time being in 2016-17 when Wembley (the football club not the stadium) halted their progress. # REMEMBERING 'THE LEATHERHEAD LIP'

Ask most neutral non-league fans of a certain vintage to name what they know best about today's visitors, and you invariably get one answer: Chris Kelly, AKA The Leatherhead Lip, writes Andrew Warshaw.

Of all non-league football's giantkilling heroes, few provoke starker memories of an era when cup shocks made headline news than Kelly, who received his sobriquet as a result of acquiring minor celebrity status for his notoriously outspoken comments. Kelly made his name during the mid-1970s and especially in 1974-5 season when The Tanners, who had never previously reached the first round of the FA Cup, turned the form book upside down with one of the most fabled runs in history.

After qualifying round wins against Croydon Amateurs, Hornchurch, Dagenham (after a replay) and Walton & Hershaw, it was off to Bishops Stortford in the first round proper where they carved out a 0-0 draw before winning the replay 2-0 and then meeting Colchester United, of the old third division and FA cup giantkillers themselves when they famously knocked out Leeds four years earlier.

A 1-0 win set up one of the biggest games in Leatherhead's history – away to Brighton, managed by Peter Taylor. Against all odds, the game was won by Kelly's brilliant individual goal. But that was nothing compared to the even bigger challenge of being drawn against mighty Leicester City of the First Division in round four. The night of the draw, Kelly was in the Match of the Day studios proudly playing up Leatherhead's chances. "Leicester are rubbish," he proclaimed cheekily. "We'll stuff them in the next round."

The tie was switched to Filbert Street, Leicester's old ground, and 11,000 Leatherhead fans turned the M1 into a sea of green and white. Remarkably, the Tanners went 2-0 up, one of them scored by Kelly. Only a goalline clearance from another Kelly strike when he was clean through prevented the visiting minnows from scoring a third before Leicester saved their blushes by hitting back to win 3-2. The FA Cup run was over but the name of the Leatherhead Lip was etched in footballing folklore for ever.

Kelly, who briefly went on to play for Millwall before returning to Fetcham Grove for another three years, now lives in the Dordogne region of France from where he still follows the Tanners' fortunes. Current Leatherhead club secretary Jeremy Smith remembers Kelly's contribution to Leatherhead as if it were yesterday. "I was at every single



one of Leatherhead's cup matches in the 1970s" Jeremy told me. "I saw all our great exploits. If Chris Kelly had not turned to celebrate what he thought was a third goal against Leicester before the ball was cleared off the line, we would definitely have been through to the fifth round.

"Chris was a diminutive number nine with the dribbling skills of a Brazilian," Jeremy continued. "We had a song about doing the Kelly shuffle. It was a great time for the club in terms of cup competitions. We should have won the FA Trophy in 1978, but we had so many catch-up games the players were exhausted and we lost 3-1 to Altrincham."

The fact that the story of the Leatherhead Lip has stuck around for decades is testament to Kelly's contribution. "He would go on tv and radio and say how much better we were than anyone else" Jeremy recalled. "It was fantastic of course but it wasn't just

him, it was the whole team. It was an experience that is almost impossible now to relate to. On the day we beat Brighton, five of went down in a Mini, or was it a Hillman Imp, driven by the guy who is still our club groundsman. Then we all went up to Leicester in coaches with, I must admit, rather a lot of alcohol consumed."

In the aftermath of that pulsating fixture The Daily Express proclaimed that Leatherhead had "done more for football than some of our professionals had done in years" while Leicester's manager Jimmy Bloomfield conceded that Kelly, who once cheekily accused Johan Cruyff of copying one of his tricks, "was almost as good as he said he was."

Jeremy was a lifelong Tanners fan well before became an integral part of the club which enjoys a strong hardcore following. He recently became treasurer as well as club secretary and has to deal with the same kind of issues and problems as so many of us do at this level. But that's what non-league football so often throws up.

"The club is in my blood. I was six years old when my dad first took me and I've supported them through thick and thin. Of course we're very much a different club in a different era these days, but no-one has ever lost sight of the fact that Chris Kelly introduced so many people to the Tanners and helped put us on the map".

# LEATHERHEAD



The 2016-17 season saw a significant overhaul at Leatherhead, both on and off the pitch. Former manager Richard Brady took up the reins as Chairman but, under new leadership and with budget cuts implemented, the Tanners' new-look first team started poorly and manager Mike Sandmann was replaced by former Fulham and Hull City midfielder Jimmy Bullard.

## IN CHARGE



### NIKKI BULL

Leatherhead turned to former Aldershot Town goalkeeper Nikki to manage the side in the summer of 2018. He had made almost 400 appearances for the 'Shots, and he has also worn the number one shirts at Brentford, Margate and Wycombe Wanderers. He is an England C international.

Bullard's reputation enabled a promising squad to be assembled, although results didn't immediately improve and only a fine run-in saw Tanners confirmed as safe from relegation in the penultimate week of the season. Bullard left in the summer and was replaced by former AFC Wimbledon and Leyton Orient player Sammy Moore. In his first managerial job, in 2017-18 he led the Tanners to the second round proper of the FA Cup, missed out on the play-offs on goal difference and reached the Surrey Senior Cup final (lost 1-3 to Merstham at Sutton United).

Unsurprisingly, Sammy moved up the non-league ladder to take over at Conference South Concord Rangers in May 2018, taking a number of his former players with him. Former Wycombe, Aldershot and Margate goalkeeper Nikki Bull was appointed in his place and a league placing of 8th, the 4th qualifying round of the F.A. Cup and the first qualifying round of the F.A. Trophy followed. Last term the side were in 9th position before the pandemic ended the season prematurely.

**ZAKI OULAH** (Goalkeeper)  
25 year-old Zaki is now in his second spell at the club. Originally signed in May 2017, he was a key part of the Tanners squad that reached the 2nd round of the FA Cup the following season. He rejoined the Fetcham Grove outfit in September 2018 following spells at Aldershot Town, Hayes & Yeading United and Hendon. His previous other clubs include Merstham, Metropolitan Police, Aylesbury and Farnborough with whom he gained promotion to the Southern League Premier Division in 2016-17.

**CROSSLEY LEMA** (Defender)  
A 21 year-old full back who graduated through the Sutton United academy, Crossley made his Us debut in a 0-3 defeat at Dover Athletic in April 2019. Following subsequent time spent on loan at Leatherhead, he signed permanently last November.

**JACK CURRIE** (Defender)  
Left back Jack, 18, made a favourable impression at Fetcham Grove during pre-season, is currently on loan from AFC Wimbledon, where he signed a professional contract recently. He made his competitive Tanners debut in a 1-1 home draw against Horsham last month.

**WILL SALMON** (Defender)  
Will started out at Aldershot before moving to AFC Wimbledon and then Ebbsfleet United in the 2009-10 season. He switched to AFC Telford and was part of their Conference North promotion-winning side, making over 80 appearances for the club before moving to Bath City in the summer of 2013. He had a short spell at Woking before signing for Met Police in January 2014 and then Leatherhead in May 2018.

**JERRY NNAMANI** (Defender)  
Formerly with Bromley, Crystal Palace and Sittingbourne, Jerry is already a Tanners legend having made over 300 appearances since becoming one of former manager Richard Brady's first signings for the club in 2011.

**MISHA DJEMAILI** (Defender)  
A versatile player who is equally at home at full back or in midfield, Misha was a member of the Essex County

Schools side that won the English Schools Under 18 County Trophy in 2017. He started last season at Tilbury but was turning out for Essex Senior League Leyton Athletic prior to joining the Tanners in February 2019. He was once on the books at Ebbsfleet United.

**DAVID OMPREON** (Defender)  
Formerly with Cheshunt, Corinthian-Casuals, Sutton Common Rovers, Sutton United and Whyteleafe, David is primarily a full back who can also operate in midfield. He started out in the AFC Wimbledon academy, and made his Tanners debut in a 1-0 pre-season friendly success at VCD Athletic in August.

**RYAN HUCKLE** (Midfield)  
After six years at the Gillingham academy, 20 year-old Ryan joined Faversham Town in the summer of 2019 having also spent some loan time at Ramsgate and Dover Athletic. He played for the Tanners in pre-season friendly victories against VCD Athletic and Epsom & Ewell before making his 2020-21 league debut against Horsham.

**WILL SEAGER** (Midfield)  
Will was a member of the Tanners' academy side when he signed first team forms in 2017. He made his first start in a 2-0 county cup win over Kingstonian in February 2018.

**CHARLIE HESTER-COOK** (Midfield)  
Charlie is a holding midfielder who was on a dual-registration arrangement with Woking towards the end of last season prior to signing permanently for the Tanners in the close season. He had made his first Cards start in a 3-2 home win against Kempston Rovers in the FA Cup in October 2018. Aged 20, he won last season's supporters' player of the year award and has also featured for Westfield.

**CRAIG MCGEE** (Midfield)  
Craig came through the academy at Sutton United before signing on at Fetcham Grove in January 2019. He established himself in the starting XI towards the end of the 2018-19 season, making his debut as a substitute in a 2-0 victory at Whitehawk in February 2019, with a series of impressive displays. He has also enjoyed a loan stint at East Grinstead Town.

**JOE LESLIE** (Midfield)  
A young winger, Joe is on loan at Fetcham Grove from Woking, for whom he signed forms recently. He came through the ranks at Stevenage and has also seen temporary service with Biggleswade.

**ANDREW BRIGGS** (Midfield)  
Andrew is a youngster who joined the Tanners from Lancing, having previously worn the colours of Eastbourne Borough during the 2018-19 season. He has won representative honours with the Sussex County FA.

**DAN ROWE** (Midfield)  
A wide player with an eye for goal, Dan signed from Oxford City in February. He started out in the academies at QPR and Leicester City, and his other clubs include Hemel Hempstead Town, Braintree Town and Boston United.

**CHARLIE DAWKINS** (Midfield)  
Charlie was once a member of the Chelsea academy. In June 2017 he signed for Aldershot as a 15-year-old. A box-to-box midfielder, he signed for the Tanners in the summer of 2019.

**STEFAN BROWN** (Forward)  
29 year-old Stefan signed from Oxford City in February. His other former clubs include Thatcham Town, AFC Totton, Basingstoke Town, Hungerford Town and Wealdstone.

**DAN HECTOR** (Forward)  
Dan joined Kingstonian in the summer of 2019 from Whyteleafe, having started out as a Merstham player who had progressed from the U23s into the first team squad at Moatside before joining 'Leafe in the 2018 close season. He made his Tanners debut last month in a 5-0 home friendly win against Staines Town, and he also wore the colours of Sutton United.

**GREAT EVANS** (Forward)  
Great made his professional debut for AFC Wimbledon in a 0-2 EFL Trophy tie defeat at Yeovil Town in December 2017. Following his release he subsequently signed for South Park, scoring 19 goals in 37 appearances during two spells at Whitehall Lane.
